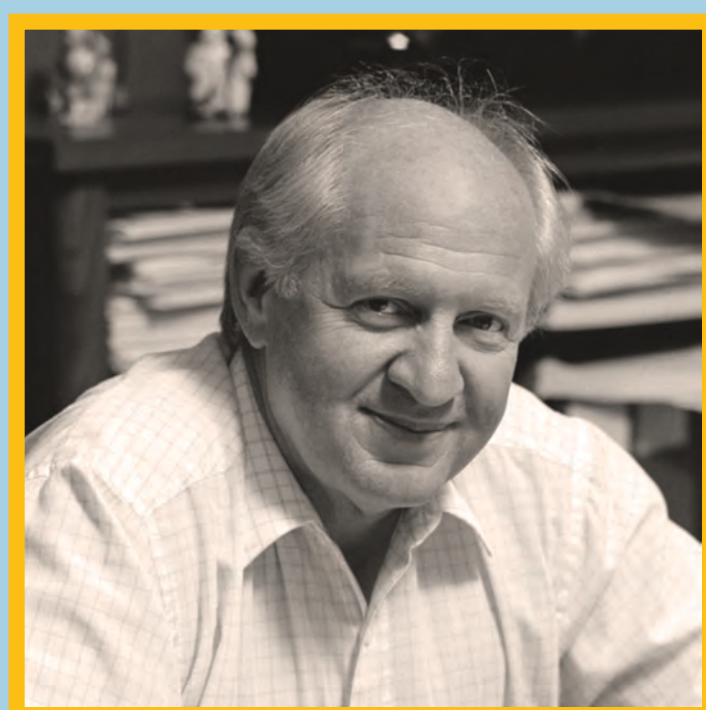
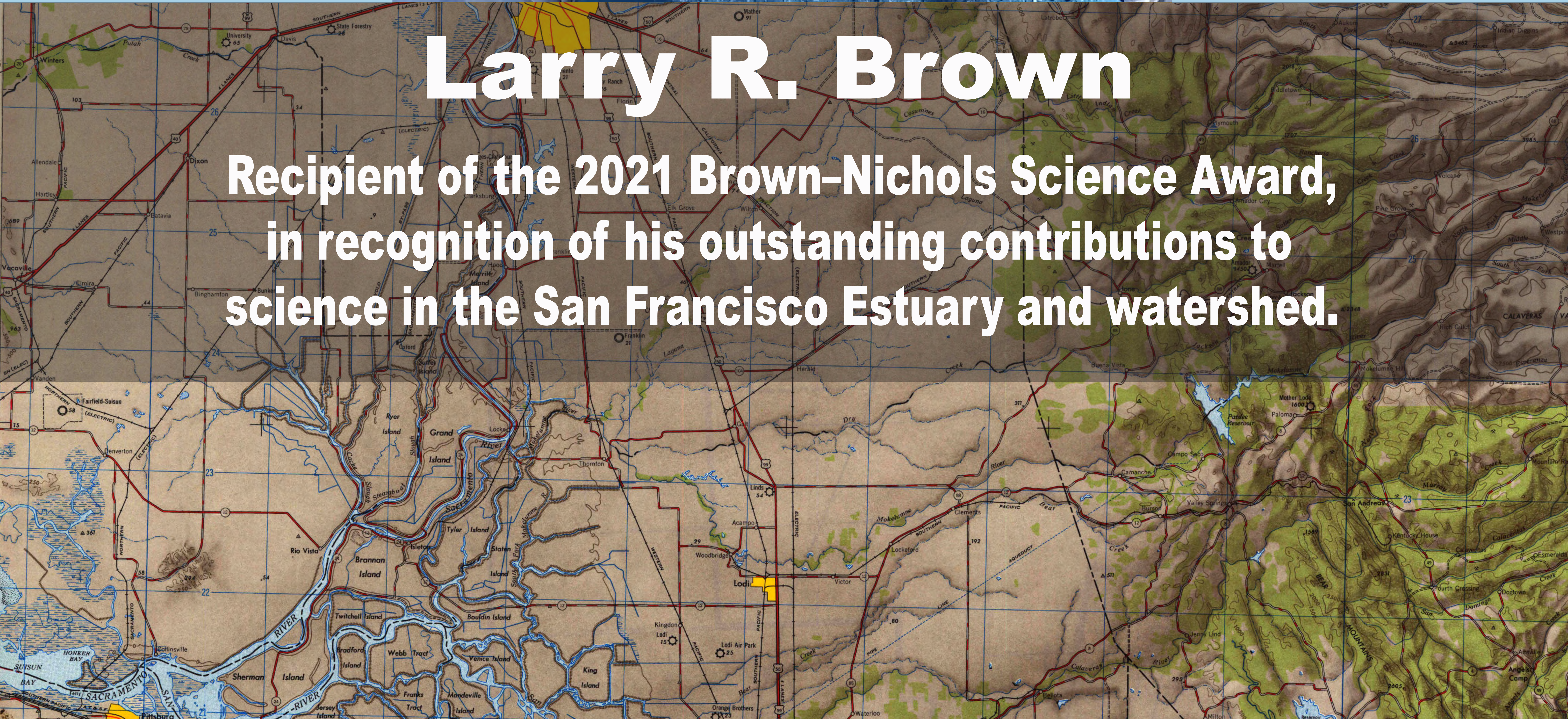
The IEP community relied heavily on Larry's unique ability to lead data analysis and synthesis efforts, including IEP work on the causes of the "Pelagic Organism Decline" in the Bay-Delta.

He participated in many efforts sponsored by the Delta (formerly CALFED) Science Program, including authoring "State of Bay-Delta Science" reports and co-chairing several biennial Bay-Delta Science Conferences. Larry was a sought-after reviewer of papers and programs, a frequent conference speaker, and a productive participant in various expert panels, review teams, and work groups. He served as President of the California-Nevada Chapter of the American Fisheries Society as well as of the Water Quality Section of the National American Fisheries Society. Larry received the Meritorious Service Award of the Department of the Interior in 2018.

Larry passed away suddenly in February 2021. He was a kind, generous, and thoughtful man and scientist who is remembered by his colleagues for being a great friend and mentor, kind, humble, and a beacon of scientific integrity. He was, above all, a kind person with a positive attitude towards life and someone who made life better for all who knew him.
